Indian Removal Socratic Seminar: Questioning Script

Persistent Issue: What actions are justified in the interest of the welfare or security of the community?

Focus Question: Was Indian Removal the best possible solution to the conflicting interests between Indian and American cultures in the 1830s?

Jackson document:

- 1. What motivated Jackson's desire for Indian removal?
- 2. How does Jackson understand the Central government's role in relations between the Indians and the states?
- 3. Why does Jacksons consider his removal proposal a "fair exchange"?

Chickasaw Document:

- 4. How would you characterize the Chickasaw attitude towards Jackson?
- 5. How would the Chickasaw respond to the arguments that Jackson makes for removal?

Synthesis:

- 6. Did the government offer a "Fair exchange' that attempted to achieve the best possible solution for all parties?
 - i) Were there realistic long-term alternatives to Indian removal?
 - ii) What would have been the likely consequences if Indians had not been removed?
 - iii) Was removal in the long-term interests of the tribes?
 - iv) Could they have expected fair or equitable treatment from the states?
 - v) Was this the only way the federal government might offer protection?
