right to protect. Specifically, Locke believed that the natural rights were "Life, Liberty, and Property". Locke believed that the government's **main** purpose is to protect peoples' natural rights. If the government does not protect peoples' natural rights, then Locke says they are justified in overthrowing the government.

Locke's ideas about natural rights and government are a direct influence on many of the thinkers and writers in American history. Many of his ideas are found in the U.S. Constitution and the Declaration of Independence.
